Annette Giermann will take over the Treasurer responsibilities and I will take over Secretary, for the time being.

We are working several projects for the Little Island. We are looking to put up-lights on our Palm Trees in the medians. Additionally we are looking to put outlets near the trees so they can be decorated with lights for the holidays. A frequent question that comes up, "Will they be on timers?" The answer is yes,

just like our lighthouses, they will turn off at a reasonable hour to not disturb our Park Avenue residents.

We are still looking to add a "Yard Arm" nautical flag pole to the first median from the bridge as a grand welcoming presence. We are looking for a sponsor or sponsors for the flag pole. \$8,000 buys you sole dedication plaque for the life of the flagpole. Linda Kensey for keeping our board informed on important airport issues in which we communicate to you.

Summer Series Meetings: We had two informative meetings. The first meeting with Councilman and neighbor **Jeff Herdman.** Jeff was candid about City's business including their position with the airport.

We also had Newport's new Harbor Master, Kurt Borsting. He request we call his department (number on the last page of this newsletter) for any harbor issue. If they are not the best contact, they will steer you to who is. They aim to be ambassadors of the harbor, make it more visitor friendly and safe.

With regard to moorings, unlike the old rules, you do not need to keep a boat on a mooring to keep it (which can result in neglected boats on moorings). His department may rent it on a short-term basis if vacant, however the demand is very low for the short-term mooring rentals.



Pots for Adoption: A change in family dynamics has made the pots up for adoption on the boardwalk at Balboa & East Bayfront. There are two pots that can be changed out, replanted, and included a dedication sign if you wish. Please let Ken know if you are interested in taking over these two pots and he will put you in touch with the BIIA Adopt-a-pot Coordinator.



Dog Messes: I remember when serving on the Balboa Island Improvement Association (BIIA) we found minutes from a meeting dating back to the 1940s. One of the dilemmas in the 1940s was dog messes. It is still an issue. What progress we've made! I jog both islands a few times a week and I am embarrassed to say, the Little Island is worse than the big island on this issue. Many of you have seen the Poop Fairy signs which aim to raise awareness. I typically pick up one to five messes a day on Little Island alone that are not from my dogs (I know there are others who do this too, thank you!). I also walk the Little Island daily and check the dispensers. We have a great crew filling the dispensers so that is not the problem. If you see someone not address their dog mess, please mention it to them. If you have rentals that allow pets, please make sure your tenants know the law (fines are from \$100 to \$500) and etiquette. Dog

owners are required to carry a container for their dog waste. Perhaps the problem is roaming pets that the owners are not aware of the dog messes. This has to improve!

The BIIA spends roughly \$12,000 annually on these dog pickup bags with no reimbursement from the City. They are supposed to be for dog walkers' emergency, not their convenience. Please take no more than two bags. Please purchase your own bags. I purchase 1,000 bags for roughly \$30 on Amazon and they use less plastic than the bags in the dispensers.

Technological Advancement: We are looking to add a website in the near future where you can check your membership status, renew online, see history, access the calendar of upcoming events, and buy items from the Little Island store. It has been a long time coming. Not to worry, for those who still want to write a check for your membership the old fashion way, we will still reserve that option for you.

If you are on Facebook, please "like" our Little Balboa Island Property Owners' page as we do post photos and announcements which you may enjoy and will help keep you informed.

Balboa Island Yacht Club (BIYC): We just did "racks down" for the BIYC. Another fun year in the books! Our oldest son, Ryan Yonkers (14) will be Commodore next year. This is a fabulous program where kids, ages 4 through 16 (they do not need to be Island residents) enjoy a wonderful 8 week program at the South Bayfront bay beach. Some kids participate just as often as they can or when in town.

Thanks to the generosity of Seymour Beek for allowing BIYC to use his dock and beach in front of his home, there is something magical about the wonderful times spent on that small patch of sand between Turquoise and Topaz on the South Bayfront. These events range from paddleboard races, swimming races, rowing races, stand-up paddleboard races (replaced diving years back allegedly due to shallow water and insurance purposes), sailing lessons and races, picnics, potlucks, movie nights at Agate Park, end-of-year banquet at the Pavilion, and other fun activities. The yacht club's youth members administer each event. The races, for example, are exclusively run by the kids.

This is the nation's only yacht club for kids run by kids. It is a Southern California Yachting Association (SCYA) affiliated yacht club, so it's an official club. Ferry Owner, Seymour Beek's parents founded the club. The story has it that his mother Carol Beek, in 1922, had an epiphany. She saw a bunch of teenagers sitting around on a nice summer day. She thought, they need something to do! Hence, BIYC was born.

The club is led by a Commodore and is supported by a Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, Treasurer and Secretary. Elections are held annually to determine how the club's leadership will play out. Each member pays a \$100 fee upon joining BIYC. The kid sailors start out on the small Sabot boats and graduate into the larger and faster Lasers.

There have been multiple generations of participants. Even the Sabot boats you see on the side of many of our homes have been passed down through the years.

Water Quality Report, by Roger Yount

One of the top five things for me about living on the Little Island is that I can walk to the end of the street, jump in the water to cool off, letting the current carry me a couple of beaches before coming out. A common question: Is the water safe? Except for the first three days after a rain, our bay is a great place to get wet. If you ever want to check for yourself, just look at this website https://ocbeachinfo.com/newport/.

Water samples are taken weekly with our closest test sites at the end of Park the end of Abalone, and in the Canal by the bridge.

If you'd ever like to know more about the attention given to our beautiful bay, consider sitting in on the monthly meeting of the Newport Beach Water Quality/Coastal Tidelands Committee. The committee meets at 4:00, the first Thursday of every month at the City Hall and is chaired by Jeff Herdman.

I take a special interest in the bay as I grew up swimming in it and continue to find it an incredibly accessible and refreshing aspect of life on our Little Island. My parents, grandparents, children, and now grandchildren also have considered it a part of Island living.

Editor's note: Board member Roger Yount, gives a quarterly report to the LBIPOA Board on our harbor water quality.


Treasurer's Report, By Annette Giermann: Our Treasury balance is currently \$22,542 (as of 7/31 bank statement). After our remaining budgeted items, we will be looking at an approximate balance of \$3,000. Thank you for your continued generous memberships which allow us to improve and beautify our community.

General Market Commentary

Interest rates are within 50 basis points of historical lows which has created an opportunity for some buyers to purchase or refinance their existing mortgages (see below).




Nationwide, existing homes sales were down 1.7% from the previous month, and 2.2% from the same time a year ago (5.2% in the West) for the 16th consecutive month. Inventories are higher but still tight. And, affordability is still low with only 24% of the people living in Orange County in a position to buy a median priced home of \$842,000 (June).

Many economists are perplexed with the slowdown in the housing market given the low interest rates, higher wages and low unemployment (50-year low).

Balboa Island Real Estate Market Overview (as of 7/24/2019)

Balboa Island active properties for sale stand at 32 with an additional 8 that are pending of under contract. This is double the levels from 18 months ago when there were 14 active listings on 2/12/2018 and 17 on 4/25/2018. Newly built homes have been in big demand, but may be slowing with the rest of market. Newly constructed homes still significantly exceed peak '07 values on a price per square foot basis.

Lot value as measured by The Balboa Island Price Index ("BIPI") for Q2 2019 was \$1,897,187. Interior lots on Balboa Island are within 5.0% of peak levels in 2007, and are down 3.5% year over year (see chart below).
