President's Report, by Ken Yonkers - November 2018



Here we head into the holidays! We all love our summers here but it is magical in the winter too. Many of you do such a nice job decorating for the holidays. Thank you for helping make our Little Island so special.

Board Member Changes: We have had a bit of turnover on the board. We regrettably accepted resignations from longtime Board members **Walt Richardson**, **John Cunningham**, and **Mickey Dunlap** (21 years). They have all provided years of service and a steady, guiding hand to the board. Their contributions were many. Health and time were the reasons given. Thank you for the many contributions you have made to our Board and our community over the years!

We would like to welcome Craig Peskind, Becky Yount, and Roger Yount (3rd generation property owner!) as new board

members.

Median Update: We have received several compliments on the improved medians. We also received several inquiries from residents on the big island asking who paid for it! We only wish there was such a thing as non-fading mulch.

The City has assured us that they will hold the City's Commercial Landscaper, Park West, to a higher level of service for our large investment (near \$12,500). We are not naïve to think that Park West and the City would maintain it to a level we need or deserve. We have hired a gardener to supplement what they do to: prune the roses, pick up branches and leaves, remove weeds, palm shoots, and trash and help guide the Jasmine hedge. We are also maintaining our colorful endcaps on the medians as well as the bridge sign entrance area.

Another thank you to **Annette Giermann** for chairing the Median Beautification Committee and all her research. We also thank **Vickie Girling, Maryanne Hunt,** and **Irene Yonkers** who were on the committee.

We initially hired a high-end local company to do our median end-caps and bridge sign area. We are not entirely pleased with them or their prices and will likely be making a change soon. However, we hope you agree, the medians have come a long way!





In-N-Out End of Summer Celebration: We had another fun community event. Thank you to Dan Mariscal who always does such a thorough job coordinating the celebration (he assigns all the Board members specific tasks!). Linda Kinsey was in charge of the bar and it went very smoothly. Your entire Board worked the event. Thanks to Irene Yonkers for coordinating the dessert from Sugar & Spice (we enjoy supporting a local company). We served 302 burgers, which was a bit shy of last year's total. We are considering extending the social part a half hour next year to allow you a longer opportunity to visit with your neighbors. Thank you to the Brown family who are always so generous allowing us to use their property at 106 Crystal.

Holiday Party: Mary and Patrick Dirk have again offered their beautiful home at 1808 S. Bayfront for the holiday party. We typically do this on the first Saturday evening of December (Dec. 1 this year). This party is open to current association members and their family guests. Dinner will again be served along with liquid refreshments. The party will be from 5 to 8 pm. Thank you to **Annette Giermann** for AGAIN coordinating this terrific community event.

Cameras are coming near Marine Avenue Bridge: Lee Pearl of the BIIA is spearheading a project to install cameras near the Marine Avenue Bridge. The City's attorneys forbid us from putting cameras on their public bridges. We can, however, install cameras on private property near the main Island Bridge. The job is being bid by 3 companies. This one-time expenditure could be near \$8,000 for a top of the line, night-time license recognition cameras and software. This would record cars coming and going over the bridge and down the two alleys near Marine Avenue. The BIIA and the Merchants Association will pay the Iion's share. Your Board voted to contribute \$1,000 to the project and it will give our association access to the feed. We feel our investment in this project is consistent with our Mission Statement (see top of first page). We are also letting them do all the leg work and we will consider doing something similar near the Little Island Bridge. We are not sure if crime has been up or social media is better at reporting it. Surprisingly, not everyone is in favor of the cameras.

Bridge Rail: We have been told the bridge portion of the rail will be finished in January (after the holidays) and match the existing stair-rail. We know there are several opinions on this, however at least there will soon be only one style of rail on our bridge. They wanted to do it in December and we thought better of it as it will likely be delayed and interfere with our bridge decorating.

Trick or Treat: Some of you have expressed disappointment in the amount of kids we get on little Island compared to the big island. Many of you want to see the cute kids in their costumes. Others of you are happy with how quiet it is and some of you were unprepared for the knock on your door. We are sorry to have disrupted you and a couple of you were very courteous to open your door and explain why you were unprepared. We look for residents who appear home (open blinds, porch lights on, etc.). Often on the big island it can be 10 kids deep on the South Bayfront to get candy. The Little Island provides a much more sedate experience for your children and grandchildren.

Dysfunctional parking space: A handful of you have inquired about the dysfunctional parking space adjacent to the Little Island Bridge. We met with City officials to see if they could build something both functional and aesthetically pleasing to store our Cert emergency supplies, along with some landscaping. This had to be attractive to not only residents who drive by it every day, but to all the families in direct view of the location. After our meeting and taking an inventory of our vast CERT emergency supplies, it was determined it was not feasible. Our storage needs are just too great. It's too bad the City did not take this into serious consideration when we requested this prior to the design phase of the bridge (they said it was not feasible).

The City plans to create a planter and have it landscaped. They intend to award the contract in late November and begin work soon after. Thank you to the **Abrams family** for offering to provide water to the location. It was a curious design from the get-go, and we are excited that it will soon be something we would enjoy looking at rather than its current blockade cones.

Where our Newsletter goes: One of the reasons we include as many photos as we do is many of our property owners are not full-time Little Island residents and they do not see many of the items we are reporting on (bridge, parking space, etc.). In fact, approximately 90 of our property owners list a primary address other than Little Island. We have several property owners who reside locally, and several in Northern California. Not as many of Pasadena or San Marino as we used to. We have property owners who reside in 9 different states. We send this newsletter to: CA, CT, FL, HI, NM, NV, SC, TX, and WA.

Flag Pole: Your board is always looking for ideas to enhance our Little Island beauty and Island spirit. One item that recently came up and we are still considering is an 18 foot flag pole to display our Little Island flag and others. We considered a couple locations and the Board voted on the first median near Abalone Avenue. As you may recall, the flag pole at East Bayfront and Park Avenue is a sewer vent with a flag on it. The flag is typically not visible as you come onto the Little Island.

Treasurer's Report, By **Donna Hammond**. Our Treasury balance is currently \$19,203. This is after our large investment in the medians. Thanks to your generous support we exceeded our budgeted expenditures. After our remaining budgeted items, we will be looking at an approximate balance of \$14,000. Thank you for your continued generous memberships which allow us to improve and beautify our community.

As you may recall, two signatures are required for our association checks and it is our typical custom to circulate a bank statement at our quarterly Board meetings.

Summer Series Meetings Recap: Due to a conflict with the BIIA, we hosted only two Summer Series Meetings this year (which seemed to be fine as we had record attendance). **Councilman Herdman** addressed our membership. It is appreciated that Jeff is always willing to be available, take questions, and be candid with our membership.

Our Second meeting we heard from reprentatives from the **Harbor Master Department**. Their main message: "We are your ambassadors on the water". Call them for assistance. They feel they can provide better service in helping manage our own Harbor than the County's Harbor Patrol. They are currently thinly staffed (in fact **Councilman Herdman** said it was good for him to hear so he can help them) but trying to make Newport a more safe and friendly boating harbor. One of the key take-aways was derelict boats. There used to be a mandate that if you owned a mooring you had to keep a boat on it which resulted in many unsightly boats on moorings. This is no longer the case! Please spread the word. Although rare, if your mooring is vacant for a period of time, the City can place a short-term rental on it.

Market Commentary: Higher inventories (active properties for sale), home prices that are increasing but leveling off, still low affordability and higher interest rates characterize the real estate market. Lot value as measured by The Balboa Island Price Index ("BIPI" TM by my son Dave) in Q3 is \$1,981,056. Interior lots on Balboa Island are within 0.95% of peak levels in 2007 and are up 6.72% year over year. Newly constructed homes are far exceeding peak '07 values.







